Petitioner-Surinder Pal @ Billa has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.37 dated 08.09.2015, registered at Police Station Pojewal, District S.B.S.Nagar, under Sections 307, 323, 342, 506, 148 and 149 of IPC and Section 302 IPC, added later on.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of respondent-State and complainant has also appeared through his counsel. They contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that the allegations are against Nasib Chand and Jaspal. The general allegations are levelled in respect of causing the injuries. Neither there is any specific attribution to the present petitioner, nor he is named in the FIR. He has been nominated by co-accused.

Similarly situated co-accused namely Ashok Kumar @ Bamba, has already been granted the concession of regular bail by this Court vide order dated 22.09.2017 passed in CRM-M-34787-2017. Moreover, the petitioner has been in custody since 15.12.2015. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
