This petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C., for grant of 'regular bail' to the petitioner, in case FIR No. 309 dated 14.06.2010, registered at Police Station Jhajjar, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 392, 397 of the IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, as also learned counsel for the State, have produced in Court today, copies of the judgment of the learned trial Court dated 20.03.2014, by which the two co-accused of the petitioner, i.e. Naseem @ Bhukkar and Harish @ Harun, have been acquitted of the charges framed against them.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that no role other than that which was attributed to the aforesaid two co-accused, has been attributed to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from the police official, who is present in Court today, to assist him, could not dispute the aforesaid factual position, though he has submitted that the petitioner is also in custody in connection with another FIR registered against him, for similar offences.

Be that as it may, with no 'additional' role attributed to the petitioner, other than what was attributed to his co-accused who have been acquitted, pertaining to FIR No. 309 dated 14.06.2010, registered at Police Station Jhajjar, for the alleged commission of offence punishable under Section 392, 397 of the IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, the petitioner shall be admitted to bail upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court. Obviously, he shall be released from custody if not in legal custody in some other case also.

The petition is disposed of accordingly.
