Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of FIR No.0155 dated 04.07.2017 under Sections 323, 506, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 14, Panchkula (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 06.10.2017 (Annexure P-2).

This Court vide order dated 10.10.2017 had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court to get their statements recorded and the learned Magistrate was directed to send its report qua the genuineness of the compromise.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, parties have appeared before learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panchkula and got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded, learned Magistrate has submitted report dated 13.12.2017 to the effect that the parties have

compromised the matter. Now they have no ill feelings against each other and the compromise in question has been entered into without any fear or pressure.

Respondent No.2-Complainant, namely, Neeraj Bansal, has made a statement with regard to compromise before learned Magistrate on 17.11.2017, whereby he has shown no objection to the FIR being quashed.

Learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for respondent No.2 have not disputed the factum of compromise between the parties.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant F.I.R.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in *Kulwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab and another 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052* and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303*, this petition is allowed and FIR No.0155 dated 04.07.2017 under Sections 323, 506, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 14, Panchkula (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioners on the basis of compromise dated 06.10.2017 (Annexure P-2).
