This petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 404 dated 12.10.2016, under Section 304-B and 34 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Rai, Sonapat.

It is contended that the petitioner has been falsely been implicated in this case and she has been in judicial custody since 13.10.2016. It is also contended that the husband of the petitioner has already been granted regular bail by this Court by order dated 07.09.2017 passed in **CRM-M-13027-2017**. It is submitted that no useful purpose would be served in keeping the petitioner behind bars as the trial is likely to take some time.

Ms. Gaganpreet Kaur, AAG, Haryana, has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested the bail application. She opposes the grant of regular bail to the petitioner, however, is not able to dispute the fact that co-accused has already been granted regular bail.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and in view of the fact that the petitioner has been in judicial custody since 13.10.2016; the trial is likely to take some time and, moreover, the co-accused, i.e. her husband, has already been granted regular bail by this Court, the instant petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on her furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.

However, any opinion expressed herein is for the purpose of grant of regular bail and not an opinion on the merits of the case.
