[2]. Admittedly, the signatures/thumb impressions of the petitioners appear on various pages of the purported agreement to sell. The property covered under the aforesaid agreement appears to have been subsequently transferred to some other person.

[3]. *Ex facie*, therefore, the ingredients of the offences of cheating at the time of execution of the purported agreement do appear to exist. The fact that the petitioners have subsequently filed a civil suit in which their claim is that they had not entered into any agreement but only a loan transaction is extraneous to the allegations made out in the FIR.

[4]. In the overall facts and circumstances, therefore, this does not appear to be a fit case to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

[5]. Dismissed.

[6]. Interim bail, if any, granted to the petitioners earlier is cancelled.
