Petitioners-Amandeep Singh @ Aman and Gagandeep Singh @ Gagan have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.36 dated 09.04.2017, registered at Police Station Sadar Nawanshahr, District SBS Nagar, under Sections 420, 413, 467, 468, 471, 473 and 482 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, was been registered on the basis of secret information. The present petitioners are named in the FIR. The allegations against the petitioners are that they had snatched a swift car and affixed a fake number plate on it. They were roaming in the area of Nawanshahr in the said car while carrying illegal weapons in large quantity.

As per the State counsel, one stolen car has been recovered from the petitioners.

The petitioners have been in custody since 09.04.2017. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
