Petitioner-Narinder Singh has filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.265 dated 10.08.2017, registered at Police Station Sector 36, Chandigarh, under Section 61 of the Punjab Excise Act, 1914 and Sections 420 and 473 of the Indian Penal Code, added later on.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the allegations, on 09.08.2017, the police party was holding a *Naka* at Sector 44, Chandigarh. At about 09.05 P.M., the present petitioner came there while driving his swift car and instead of stopping the car, he tried to run away. But due to barricades, the car was stopped. However, the present petitioner ran away after stopping it. Thereafter, 30 boxes of countrymade liquor have been

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found in the car. It is also the case of prosecution that number plate of the vehicle was also found to be fake.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case, I find that the petitioner is required for custodial interrogation. Therefore, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
