INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner-Harpreet Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.181 dated 18.09.2016, registered at Police Station City Kharar, District SAS Nagar, under Sections 420 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

Learned State counsel submitted that the matter of this FIR was inquired into by the DSP concerned, who opined that Shaminder

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Singh, Happy and Darshan Singh, property dealers, had facilitated the sale of the plot to Jaspreet Kaur and thereafter again, they had facilitated the sale of the said plot to the complainant. The possession of the plot was given to Surinder Kaur and involvement of Jaspreet Kaur, Harpreet Singh (present petitioner), Shaminder Singh, Happy and Darshan Singh was opined to be there.

The offences are triable by the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class. The petitioner has been in custody since 03.09.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
