The petitioner and complainant would state that dispute between the parties has been settled by way of compromise in the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of the Court vide settlement agreement dated 09.03.2017. In pursuance thereof, parties have already filed a joint petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 and their statements in first motion have been recorded. The complainant would state that she has already received an amount of Rs.1 lakh at the time of recording of statements in first motion and another amount of Rs.1 lakh would be paid to her at the time of recording of statements in second motion. She states that in view of the compromise, the petition may be disposed of.

In view of the above, the petition stands disposed of, interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 08.11.2016 is made absolute subject to the following conditions:-

(i) he shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;

- (ii) he shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;
- (iii) he shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.

However, the parties shall remain bound by the terms and conditions of the compromise.
