Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

Petitioner seeks regular bail in FIR No.77 dated 31.08.2017, under Sections 326, 323, 324, 341, 148 & 149 of IPC, registered at Police Station Sadar Gurdaspur, District Gurdaspur.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is in custody from 14.09.2017 and the investigation has been completed.

Perusal of the Medical Report filed in the Court today, I find that injuries are not grievous.

Registry is directed to put the medical report on exact place.

Be that as it may, the trial would take time to conclude.

On instructions received from the petitioner, learned counsel states that the petitioner would not enter in Village Hemrajpur till the trial is completed.

Statement is accepted. The petitioner's bail will be cancelled in case of violation of its regular bail.

In that view of the matter, I make the following order:

ORDER

- (i) The CRM-M-39281 of 2017 is allowed.
- (ii) The petitioner be released on bail to the satisfaction of the concerned CJM/Duty Magistrate.
- (iii) The petitioner shall report to the concerned Police Station on every Sunday, Monday and Wednesday between 11 am to 4 pm. The police shall keep surveillance on the petitioner.
- (iv) The petitioner will not enter in Village Hemrajpur till the trial is completed.
- (v) The petitioner to surrender his passport with the trial Court, if he possesses the same.
