Petitioner-Gurmeet Singh @ Getti Singh has filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.186 dated 25.08.2017, registered at Police Station Kotwali Bathinda, under Sections 188, 144, 143, 153-A, 153-B, 436 and 511 of IPC and Sections 3 and 4 of the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act.

Notice of motion was issued in this case. Learned State counsel has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been registered on the basis of secret information against co-accused Sunil Kumar and Rohit Kataria that they were having petrol bottles and other deadly weapons and their intention was to cause loss of life and property by committing the fire incident in the city for holding Gurmeet Ram Rahim, Head of Dera Sirsa, guilty by the Panchkula Court, as done in Panchkula, Sirsa and other cities of Punjab. It is mentioned in the order dated 28.09.2017 passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Bathinda that petrol bottles, match-box, red chilly powder, iron rod and a motor-cycle were recovered from Sunil Kumar and Rohit Kataria. As per the prosecution, the present petitioner is named by the eye-witness in this case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and nature and gravity of the offence, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
