In this petition, the petitioners pray for quashing of FIR No.742, dated 29.09.2015, under Sections 504, 452, 506, 191, 149 & 148 of the Indian Penal Code (in short 'IPC'), registered at Police Station Sirsa City, District Sirsa (Annexure P-1), on the basis of compromise arrived at between the parties.

[2]. At this stage, Mr. Rajesh Sethi, Advocate has put in appearance and filed Power of Attorney on behalf of respondent No.2-complainant and admits the factum of compromise.

[3]. It may be mentioned that the original FIR was lodged by respondent No.2, who happens to be father-in-law of petitioner No.1. Earlier the said petitioner had lodged FIR No.524 dated 29.07.2014, under Sections 323, 406, 498-A, 506 & 120-B of the IPC against her husband and other members of his family including the complainant/respondent No.2. Thereafter, the parties entered into an amicable compromise by way of dissolution of their marriage by mutual consent, followed by quashing of the

FIR lodged by the present petitioner No.1, which was allowed by a Coordinate Bench of this Court in **CRM-M-37426-2016** on 19.09.2017 (Annexure P-5).

[4]. In pursuance of the very same amicable compromise between the parties clearly, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the present proceedings alive, especially, in view of the decisions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in "**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**", 2012(4) **RCR (Criminal) 543** and "**Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another**", (2014) 6 SCC 466, more particularly since the parties in the present proceedings have been closely related to each other.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. FIR No.742, dated 29.09.2015, under Sections 504, 452, 506, 191, 149 & 148 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Sirsa City, District Sirsa (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed *qua* the present petitioners.
