Learned counsel for the complainant submits that the complainant has now filed a revision petition against the dismissal of his complaint, vide an order of the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ludhiana, dated 19.01.2016.

The issue, however, is whether, as already noticed in the order dated 22.02.2017, after a complaint has been dismissed by a competent court, an FIR would be maintainable on the same cause of action or not.

Now with the complainant also having filed an appeal, this being a petition only seeking anticipatory bail to the petitioner, in the aforesaid circumstances, the petition is allowed and the order dated 28.11.2016 is made absolute.
