SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are the accused persons in F.I.R No.192, dated 28th May, 2015, under Sections 323, 324, 506, 34 of the Indian Penal Code (Section 326 of the IPC added later) registered at Police Station Farakpur, District Yamuna Nagar (Annexure P-1) have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending in the Court of Ld. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhari on the basis of compromise.

2. During pendency of petition, the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused persons vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhari, vide report dated 25th August, 2017 has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

3. Respondents No. 2 is represented by his counsel.

4. In view of the report of the Ld. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhari, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/accused persons.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed.

F.I.R No.192, dated 28th May, 2015, under Sections 323, 324, 506,

34 of the Indian Penal Code (Section 326 of the IPC added later) registered at Police Station Farakpur, District Yamuna Nagar (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed *qua* the present petitioners.
