INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner-Ajit has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.323 dated 25.12.2016, registered at Police Station Naraingarh, District Ambala, under Sections 212, 306, 365, 386 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, the deceased had taken money from so many persons and ₹93,15,000/- was given to Ram Nath for getting the employment to them. The present petitioner

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alongwith other persons, who gave the money, kidnapped the deceased and obtained his signatures on blank papers. Further, there is an allegation that brothers of Ram Nath namely Satbir etc. told the deceased do whatever he likes, but they will not return the money and thereafter, deceased-Baljeet Singh committed suicide.

The petitioner has been in custody since 23.07.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. Challan has already been presented; charges have already been framed and no witness has been examined so far and, therefore, trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
