The present petition directs challenge against judgment dated 08.10.2008 passed by the Additional Sessions Judge, Kaithal whereby the respondents *namely* Gagandeep Singh and Mukhtiar Singh have been acquitted of the offence punishable under Sections 452, 376 read with Section 511 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Counsel for the petitioner would submit that he does not challenge the judgment passed by the trial Court so far as recording of an order favourable to the respondents, acquitting of the offence charged against them but the observations recorded by the trial Court in para 21 of the judgment which may reflect on character of the petitioner for

generations to come, may be set aside. It has been further submitted that the trial Court has made these observations on the basis of certain documents but those documents were never proved in accordance with law.

Counsel for the respondents have got no objection if the observations recorded by the trial Court in para 21 of the judgment, reflecting on character of the petitioner may be set aside.

In view of the above, the petition stands disposed of but observations made by the trial Court “*but certain documents have been placed on record which reveal that the residents of village Pharal had moved an application before Superintendent of Police, Kaithal that the business of prostitution was deep rooted in village Pharal and prosecutrix is named lady in that letter written on 26.06.2006*”, would not cause prejudice to the petitioner in any manner whatsoever.
