The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.104 dated 25.08.2017 under Sections 436/153-A/143/124-A/120-B/148/149/109 IPC, Sections 3/4 of the Prevention of damage to Public Property Act and Sections 3/4 of the Explosive Substances Act, registered at Police Station Phul, District Bathinda.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner is not named in the FIR and he has been arraigned as an accused on the disclosure statement of accused, who were named in the FIR, wherein it was alleged that the petitioner has been instigating the mob to set on fire the service centre.

Learned counsel further contends that petitioner is 75 years old and is suffering from various ailments, including tumor in prostate.

Learned State counsel has filed medical status report by way of affidavit of Superintendent, Central Jail, Bathinda, along with the copy of medical report Annexure R-1/T submitted by the Medical Officer, Central Jail, Bathinda, wherein the Medical Officer has stated that the petitioner is suffering from Prostate Tumor and is undergoing treatment from PGI, Chandigarh.

Heard.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, especially when the petitioner is suffering from prostate tumor, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed. Petitioner Jora Singh is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
