The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No. 141 dated 18.10.2016, under Sections 324, 452, 506 IPC (Section 307 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Satnali, District Mahendergarh (Haryana).

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations against the petitioner in the FIR are that he had given knife blows on the stomach and back of the complainant. He further contends that the petitioner had earlier been granted regular bail as the FIR was initially registered under Sections 324, 452 and 506 IPC and offence under Section 307 IPC was added after seven months on 11.05.2017. Learned counsel also contends that the petitioner is in custody for over 06 months since his arrest on 13.05.2017.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from HC Sunil Kumar states that the investigation has been completed and six out of 14 prosecution witnesses have been examined.

Heard.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, especially when the petitioner was initially on regular bail and is again in custody for over 06 months and conclusion of the trial is likely to take sometime, I deem it appropriate to grant him the concession of regular bail.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed. The petitioner, namely, Tulsi Ram is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bail bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
