REKHA MITTAL, J.(Oral)

The petitioner prays for grant of regular bail in FIR No.131 dated 02.07.2016 registered with Police Station Phillaur (Jalandhar) for offence punishable under Sections 306, 511, 354-D of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (later Section 306 IPC was invoked).

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that material witnesses in the case namely Tilak Raj – complainant, Sukhwinder Kaur, his wife and Rajinder Kumar have already been examined and they failed to support cause of the prosecution. It is further submitted that the petitioners are ready to face the proceedings, in accordance with law.

Counsel for the State concedes to the position with regard to examination of the aforesaid witnesses and the fact that they have not supported the prosecution.

In view of the above, without meaning to express any opinion on merits of the controversy, the petitioner shall be released on bail subject

to satisfaction of the trial Court. However, he shall abide by the following conditions:-

- (i) he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with facts of the case so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the Court;
- (ii) he shall not leave India without previous permission of the Court.
