Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No. 1347 dated 14.10.2016 registered under Sections 323, 354, 377, 406, 498-A, 506 IPC at Police Station Panipat City, Haryana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner and learned counsel for respondent no.2 inform that the matter has been amicably resolved between the parties. A photocopy of the compromise dated 21.07.2017, produced in Court today is taken on record subject to just exceptions. The petitioner and respondent no.2 have decided to part ways.

Learned counsel for respondent no.2 submits that his client has no objection in case this petition is allowed subject to the petitioner adhering strictly to the terms and conditions of the settlement arrived at between them.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from SI Gayatri Devi, Police Station Panipat City, Haryana, affirms that the petitioner has joined investigation.

There are no allegations on behalf of the State that the petitioner is likely to abscond or that he is likely to dissuade the witnesses from deposing true facts in the Court, if released on bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances noted above, especially the settlement arrived at between the parties, but without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, it is considered just and expedient to allow this petition. Consequently, order dated 09.12.2016 is made absolute.
