The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.975 dated 07.11.2017 under Sections 15(2), 15(3) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and Sections 420/336 IPC registered at Police Station Hisar City , District Hisar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that allegations against the petitioner are that he is practicing as a Doctor at Sanjeewani Clinic, Raipur Road, without any genuine certificate or document. He further contends that petitioner is undergoing Multi Purpose Health Worker (Male) two years' course from Pandit Bhagwat Dayal Sharma University of Health Science, Rohtak. On 07.11.2017, when the raid had been allegedly conducted in the Clinic, he was taking examination with regard to that course. He also contends that only medical instruments have

been allegedly recovered but there is no instance of the petitioner having any patient. The clinic is run by one Ram Kumar, with whom the petitioner has no connection.

This Court, by the order dated 16.11.2017 had directed the petitioner to join investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jagbir Singh, states that in pursuance to the order dated 16.11.2017, the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, the order dated 16.11.2017, granting ad-interim bail to the petitioner, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
