Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of FIR No.45 dated 13.03.2014 under Section 420 IPC and Section 24 of the Immigration Act registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Bathinda, District Bathinda along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom including the order dated 20.02.2016, vide which the petitioner was declared proclaimed offender, on the basis of compromise dated 31.10.2017 effected between the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that so far as prayer for quashing of the FIR in question is concerned, he does not press the same at this stage. He further states that the petitioner has been declared as a proclaimed offender vide order dated 20.02.2016 passed by the trial Court.

However, the petitioner is ready to surrender before the trial Court and to face the trial provided he be granted bail by the trial Court.

Notice of motion.

On asking of this Court, Mr. M.S. Nagra, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State.

At this stage, Mr. Davinder Kumar, Advocate has put in appearance and filed power of attorney on behalf of respondent No.2, which is taken on record.

Heard.

Considering the limited prayer of the petitioner and the inclination shown by the petitioner that he is ready to surrender before the trial Court and to face the trial in accordance with law, the petitioner is directed to surrender before the trial Court within a week from today on which he shall be admitted on bail subject to furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court. He shall also furnish an undertaking before the trial Court that he shall keep on attending the Court regularly.

Disposed of in these terms.
