Following is the prayer in the present petition:

That directions be issued to respondent No.1 to 6 to investigate the complaint/representations of the petitioner Annexure P-3 to P-6 and issue necessary directions to respondent No.6 to take suitable action in view of the facts and circumstances of the case against respondent No.7 as per law expeditiously.

Learned counsel for the petitioner makes a statement that the petitioner has been shot dead in the year 2016.

Learned counsel for respondent No.7 makes statement that since the legal representatives have not been brought on record, therefore, the petition is not maintainable.

The submission is made for being rejected.

The next aspect of the matter is about the investigation on the grievance made by the petitioner. It appears from the affidavit filed by Onkar Singh, Sub Inspector, Inquiry Officer, Women Police Station, Sector-17, Chandigarh that the petitioner had, during investigation that was taken up by the Chandigarh Police, wished to get her complaint transferred to the Amritsar Police.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner had grievance that the Punjab Police was not making proper investigation and had no faith in Punjab Police. It is in that view the investigation was given to the Chandigarh Police. However, she gave a petition to transfer to Punjab Police.

Be that as it may, since she did not want investigation by the Punjab Police and it was handed over the Chandigarh Police, it will be proper that the investigation be continued by the Chandigarh Police. The Chandigarh Police shall complete the investigation in any case within three months from today and shall file a status report before this Court. It is made clear that no further time shall be granted to the Chandigarh Police for completing investigation.

The petition stands disposed of with directions as aforesaid.
