This order shall dispose of the aforesaid two petitions i.e.
CRM-M-45315 of 2016 titled as “Jagdeep Vs. State of Union Territory,
Chandigarh” and CRM-M-20480 of 2017 titled as Manoj Kumar @
Manoj Dhull and another Vs. State of Union Territory, Chandigarh” with
a common order.

Prayer in these petitions under Section 438 Cr.P.C. has been
made for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners, namely Jagdeep,
Manoj Kumar @ Manoj Dhull and Krishan in case FIR No.182, dated

07.10.2016, registered under Sections 451/380/120-B, IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 11, Chandigarh.

Briefly stated that the complainant, Dr.Varun Malik, Advocate by profession claiming himself to be a tenant under Shri Harkrishan Singh, the original owner, over the property in question i.e. House No.67, Top Floor, Sector 15-A, Chandigarh, moved a complaint against the petitioners that they have illegally and forcibly occupied the tenanted premises by taking away his household articles with an intention to grab the property. On the basis of which, the aforesaid FIR was registered. The application for ad-interim mandatory injunction filed by the applicant-plaintiff, Varun Malik has been dismissed by the Civil Judge, (Jr.Divn.) Chandigarh vide order dated 18.07.2017.

Learned counsel for the U.T.Chandigarh-respondent No.1/State has submitted that the petitioners have joined the investigation in compliance of orders dated 19.12.2016 and 01.06.2017 and nothing has to be recovered from any of the petitioners.

In view of the totality of the facts and circumstances of the case, the orders dated 19.12.2016 and 01.06.2017 passed by this Court, granting ad interim bail to the petitioners namely *Jagdeep, Manoj Kumar @ Manoj Dhull and Krishan*, are made absolute.

Both the petitions stand disposed of accordingly.
