INDERJIT SINGH, J.

This order shall dispose of CRM-M-45563-2016, titled as 'Paramjit Singh @ Pamma vs. State of Punjab' and CRM-M-45590-2016, titled as 'Ujjal Singh @ Bittu vs. State of Punjab', filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.106 dated 25.06.2016, registered at Police Station Daaba, District Ludhiana, under Sections 323,

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324, 341, 506, 148 and 149 IPC and Sections 326 and 307 IPC added later on.

Notice of motion has been issued in both these petitions.

On the asking of Court, Mr. Deep Singh, learned Assistant Advocate General, Punjab has accepted notice on behalf of the respondent-State in both these petitions. Mr. Harpreet S. Rakhra, Advocate has also appeared on behalf of the complainant and filed power of attorneys in both these petitions. They contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners; learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for complainant and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the prosecution version, both the petitioners are stated to be armed with *datars* and injuries are attributed to them. However, no injury has been declared dangerous to life by the doctor till now.

Challan has already been presented. The petitioners have been in custody since 19.07.2016. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on regular bail

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subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
