Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

Petitioner seeks grant of regular bail in FIR No.117 dated 12.06.2015, under Sections 380, 342, 397, 457, 412, 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Sahnewal, District Ludhiana.

In FIR in question, the petitioner was granted bail by the trial Court and accordingly, he was on bail. However, he then absented himself and was declared proclaimed offender on 20.10.2016.

In view of the fact that the learned State counsel, on instructions from the police official submits that there is no other case against the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant him bail. Learned State counsel further submits that two and half quintal copper wire was stolen but that was recovered.

In that view of the matter, this petition is allowed.

Petitioner shall be released on bail subject to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned, subject to his depositing costs in the sum of ₹10,000/- (non-refundable) with the trial Court as a pre-condition. Petitioner shall report to the police station concerned on Monday, Wednesday and Sunday between 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM every week in addition to appearing before the trial Court on the dates fixed. Petitioner shall file undertaking before the police station concerned that he will not commit/indulge in similar or any other kind of offence in future. Petitioner shall deposit his passport, if possesses, with the trial Court. Petitioner shall not tamper, influence and threaten the prosecution witnesses and complainant as well. In case of violation of the above condition on the part of the petitioner, the liberty is reserved in favour of the State to apply for cancellation of bail.
