These two petitions arise out of an FIR registered against the petitioners in CRM-M-8590-2017, with a cross-case version thereto being registered against the petitioner in CRM-M-4488-2017.

Learned counsel for the petitioners in both cases submit that as a matter of fact the matter has been compromised between the parties, i.e. the petitioners in these two petitions.

Consequently, in CRM-M-4488 of 2017, the order dated 13.02.2017 is made absolute.

In CRM-M-8590-2017, since no interim order was issued, in the aforesaid circumstance, it is directed that upon the petitioners joining investigation, if they are sought to be arrested, they would be released on bail to the satisfaction of the arresting officer/Illaqa Magistrate, subject to their continued joining of investigation and complying with all conditions stipulated in Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C.

The petitions are disposed of accordingly.
