This petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.165 dated 24.07.2016, under Sections 306/34 IPC, registered at Police Station, Salhawas, District Jhajjar.

The petitioner is in custody since 26.07.2016. As per allegations in the FIR, the complainant was told by the villagers that his daughter (deceased) had been beaten up by her in-laws throughout night and thereafter, she had consumed poison.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that children of deceased are staying with the family of the petitioner.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Joginder Singh, has informed the Court that as per report given by the Forensic Science Laboratory, Haryana, no common poison could be detected in Saline preservative Ex.1d. However, aluminium phosphide was detected in Ex.1a, 1b and 1c. She has further informed that 14 prosecution witnesses have to

be examined before the trial Court.

Keeping in view the period of incarceration of the petitioner and the fact that trial may take some time for its conclusion, this Court feels that there is no need to detain the petitioner any longer. Accordingly, this petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on regular bail on furnishing of bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate, Jhajjar.
