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DEEPAK SIBAL, J. (Oral)

Through the present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.26 dated 16.03.2015, registered under Sections 434, 379, 148, 149 IPC, at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar.

Vide order dated 29.12.2016, while issuing notice of motion, this Court had ordered that in the event of arrest, petitioner shall be released on ad-interim anticipatory bail subject to the satisfaction of the arresting officer.

As per the allegations in the FIR, the petitioners have alleged to have demolished a pillar and stolen bricks from the foundation stone in village Granthgarh, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioners

have falsely been implicated in the present case due to party faction; the co-accused of the petitioners namely Sahib Singh and others, who had approached this Court through **CRM-M No.6990 of 2016 - 'Sahib Singh and others vs. State of Punjab'**, through order dated 06.04.2016, have been granted anticipatory bail and that the petitioners have joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Shamsheer Singh, submits that in pursuance to the ad-interim anticipatory bail granted to the petitioners, they have joined investigation and are no longer needed for any further questioning.

In the view of the above, the petition is allowed and order dated 29.12.2016 granting ad-interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made absolute subject to the conditions as prescribed under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Nothing observed herein above shall be considered to be an expression of opinion by this Court on the merits of the case.
