CRM-M-4820-2017

This is a petition under Section 482 Cr. P.C. for issuance of direction to respondents No. 3 and 4 to do fair and impartial investigation in FIR No. 30 dated 2.3.2016 under Section 177, 420 IPC and Section 12 of the Passport Act, 1967 (for short 'the Act') (Annexure P-2).

Mr. D.D. Tripathi, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of respondents No. 6 to 9 in Court. He submits that matter has been settled between the parties before the Family Courts, Dwarka Court, New Delhi. He has submitted a copy of settlement arrived at between the parties dated 4.8.2017, which is exhibited as Mark 'A'.

As per the said settlement, parties will approach this Court for seeking quashing of the FIR No. 30/16 under Section 177/420 IPC and 12 of the Act, registered at Police Station Ludhiana, Division V, Punjab.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Tralochan Singh, also submits that cancellation report has already been prepared in the aforesaid FIR.

Since, the only prayer in this petition is to direct respondents No. 3 and 4 to do fair and impartial investigation of the aforesaid FIR No. 30, in view of submissions made by learned counsel appearing for respondents No. 6 to 9, no further action is required in this petition. The same is rendered as infructuous.

Disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
