H.S. MADAAN, J. (Oral):

This petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C seeking transfer of the investigation of FIR No. 413 dated 26.12.2015, for the offences under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 474, 477, 120-B of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sirsa Sadar, to some independent agency like Crime Branch or by constitution of a Special Investigating Team for arrest of the culprits accordingly. This petition came up for hearing on 26.02.2016, when notice of motion was issued to the official respondents. Status report by way of affidavit of Sh. Ravinder Kumar, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sirsa was filed on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4, on 11.04.2016. Thereafter, supplementary status report in the form of affidavit of Vijay

Kumar Kakkar, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police (HQ) Sirsa, was filed on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 4.

Learned State counsel states that the original account opening form of the complainant and the cheques have been sent to Forensic Science Laboratory, Madhuban (Karnal) and report from there is awaited.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner would be fully satisfied if the official-respondents are directed to complete the investigation in a time bound manner and then submit the final report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. in the Court

This submission of the counsel for the petitioner seems to be genuine. Accordingly, the official-respondents are directed to complete the investigation of FIR No. 413 dated 26.12.2015, for the offences under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 474, 477, 120-B of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sirsa Sadar, within a period of three months from today and then file the final report under Section 173 Cr.P.C in the Court of law.

With such observations, the petition in hands stands disposed of.
