This petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C., for grant of 'regular bail' to the petitioner in case FIR No. 516 dated 28.12.2015, registered at Police Station Madlauda, District Panipat, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 395, 397, 120-B of the IPC and 25/54/59 of the Arms Act.

As recorded in the order dated 22.02.2017, learned counsel for the petitioner reiterates that the petitioner is similarly placed as other two co-accused, i.e. Suresh and Sunil @ Sheena, who have already been admitted to bail.

It had been noticed in that order that though the aforesaid Suresh had already been admitted to bail vide an order of this Court dated 31.01.2017 passed in **CRM-M-2367-2017**, the said order does not state that a pistol had been recovered from him.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from the police official who is present in Court today to assist him, however does not deny the fact that a pistol each was stated to have been recovered from the aforesaid Suresh as also the petitioner Arvind.

He further submits that as per the query of this Court dated 22.02.2017, it has been confirmed that both the co-accused of the petitioner are regularly appearing before the trial Court after they were granted bail, as and when summoned by that Court.

Keeping in view the above and the fact that the petitioner is seen to be similarly placed as the aforesaid Suresh, who has been admitted to bail, the petition is allowed, simply on the criterion of parity. The petitioner shall be admitted to bail upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court.
