AMOL RATTAN SINGH J. (ORAL)

By this petition, the petitioner seeks permission to go to Australia. The petition having been filed in February 2017, permission was sought to travel to Australia from February to November 2017 due to the conditions stated to be stipulated in the visa issued to the petitioner's minor son, that during his study period in Australia, he must be accompanied by one of his parents.

Though if that was the condition precedent, the petitioner's sons' visa would have been cancelled till now or some application would have been filed stating that he has been granted extended time, which has not been done.

However, all the co-accused of the petitioner are stated to have been acquitted and now learned counsel for the petitioner submits that even the appeal against such acquittal has been dismissed by a Division Bench of this Court on 29.3.2017, with a copy of that order annexed as Annexure A.2 with CRM-12565-2017.

Hence, I see no purpose in restraining the petitioner from travelling abroad, with her case, prima facie at least, not seen to be different from her co-accused.

It is to be noticed that the petitioner was not tried along with the co-accused because at the time of trial she is stated to have been in Australia.

Consequently, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is permitted to travel to Australia from 10.6.2017 to 30.11.2017, upon her furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court. She shall, consequently, appear before the trial Court on 2.12.2017.

The petition itself is thus disposed of.
