Petitioner-Baljit Singh Dhaliwal has filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.19 dated 20.01.2017, registered at Police Station Tripuri, Patiala, under Sections 353, 186 and 173 of the Indian Penal Code.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been registered on the statement of complainant-Ram Milan, Process-Server. As per the version of FIR, when he went to the house of Mukhtiar Singh to get served the notice issued by this Court in FAO No.4652/2015, Mukhtiar Singh took the summons and signed on his copy and also on behalf of his wife-Dilawar Kaur. Mukhtiar Singh asked the complainant to stay there for

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5 minutes as his son, the present petitioner was coming. Thereafter, when the present petitioner came, he abused the complainant, scuffled with him; torn the summons where the signatures were appended and turned out the complainant from holding his collar.

Keeping in view the above facts and circumstances, I find that no ground is made out for grant of anticipatory bail to the present petitioner.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
