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DEEPAK SIBAL, J. (Oral)

Through the present petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C., quashing of FIR No.80 dated 14.06.2016, registered under Sections 420, 406, 465, 467, 471 IPC, at Police Station Chajli, District Sangrur, is sought for on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2).

Through order of this Court dated 23.02.2017, the parties were directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate to get their statements recorded, who in turn was directed to send a report to this Court with regard to the veracity of the compromise, if any, between the parties as also to inform whether the petitioners or any of their co-accused have ever been declared as proclaimed offender and is there any other case pending against them.

As directed, report dated 26.04.2017, from the Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Sunam, has been received, as per which the parties recorded their statements before the trial Court in terms of the compromise

arrived at between them, there is no other case pending against them and none of them has ever been declared proclaimed offender.

Learned State counsel has also no objection, if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above as also for the reasons that the dispute is between the private parties, commercial in nature, in which the investigation is yet to complete and the matter having been compromised, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance to the afore-referred FIR, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others versus State of Haryana and others, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, I deem it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash the FIR No.80 dated 14.06.2016, registered under Sections 420, 406, 465, 467, 471 IPC, at Police Station Chajli, District Sangrur and all proceedings arising therefrom.
