This order shall dispose of CRM-M-6756-2017, titled as 'Komal Vs. State of Punjab' and CRM-M-7505-2017, titled as 'Neetu alias Varinder Khanna Vs. State of Punjab', filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.208 dated 22.10.2016,

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registered at Police Station Kotwali Patiala, District Patiala, under Sections 365, 363 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in both these petitions. Learned State counsel appeared and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, three women impersonating themselves as doctors induced the complainant and took her alongwith her child to Rajendra Hospital and then to Gurudwara. They also provided some food items and clothes etc. When the complainant went to change the new clothes, as per conspiracy of those ladies her one month child namely Ashwin was taken away and sold to Komal Gupta.

Petitioner-Neetu alias Varinder Khanna and petitioner-Komal have been in custody since 06.11.2016 and 07.11.2016, respectively. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be

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released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of
₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of
the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
