By filing the present petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioners have sought anticipatory bail in FIR No.158 dated 14.12.2016, registered under Section 498-A of IPC, at Women Police Station, District Jalandhar City.

On 02.03.2017, this Court had passed the following order:-

*“Counsel for the petitioners inter alia contends that the complainant and her husband are the doctors and during enquiry by the police it was found that the husband and wife had been staying separately from the remaining family of the husband. It is further submitted that husband of the complainant was allowed benefit of interim bail by this court and the parties have been relegated to the Mediation*

*and Conciliation Centre of this Court to explore possibility of an amicable settlement vide order dated 9.2.2017 and the case is fixed for 30.5.2017.*

*Notice of motion for 30.5.2017.*

*In the meanwhile, the petitioners shall join investigation within a period of 10 days. In case, they join the investigation within the stipulated period, they shall be released on interim bail by the investigating officer subject to the following conditions:-*

- (i) They shall join the investigation as and when required by the Investigating Officer.*
- (ii) They shall not offer any threat, promise or inducement to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing the same to the Investigating Officer/Court; and*
- (iii) They shall not leave the limits of this country without prior permission of the Court.*

*To be heard along with CRM-M- 46724 of 2016.”*

Petitioner No.1 Ujagar Singh, present in person states that a compromise has been reached between the parties. He and his son Ranbir Singh (co-accused) have agreed to pay Rs. 12 lakh within four weeks from today.

Father of respondent No. 2, Gurjit Singh present in the Court duly identified by the Investigating Officer states that he has no objection in case the present petition is allowed subject to undertaking made by petitioner No.1.

Keeping in view the above, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 02.03.2017, is made absolute, subject to

furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned  
Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, concerned.

The petition stands allowed.

However, it is made clear that in case the amount of Rs.  
12 lakh is not paid within the stipulated period, the present petition  
shall be deemed to have been dismissed without further notice.
