Petitioner Sikandar alias Kali has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.21, dated 09.02.2014 registered at Police Station Division No.7, District Ludhiana, under Sections 307/323/506/34 IPC.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Deep Singh, AAG, Punjab has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

As per the record, I find that as per the prosecution version, the present petitioner has been named in the FIR and has been stated to be armed with toka. He gave simple injury under Section 323 IPC on the left arm of the complainant. Other allegation against the present petitioner is that he caught hold injured Raman. The petitioner was earlier declared a proclaimed offender, but he is in custody since his arrest i.e. 22.08.2016.

As per learned counsel for the petitioner, parties have already effected a compromise, copy of which is Annexure P-2. The petitioner is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹1,00,000/- with two sureties in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
