This common order will dispose of both the petitions arising out
of the same FIR.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

In FIR No.206 dated 24.10.2011 registered under Sections 323,
324, 341 and 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Section 326 of 'IPC' was added
lateron) at Police Station Sadar, Jagraon, District Ludhiana Rural the
petitioners are being prosecuted.

Learned counsel for both the parties have stated that compromise has been arrived at between the parties. This Court vide orders dated March 10, 2017 and March 16, 2017 respectively had directed the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate to record the statements of the parties in view of the compromise and verify whether the same is genuine or not. Now, there is a report received from the Civil Judge (Junior Division)-cum-Judicial Magistrate 1st class, Jagraon showing that the statements of the parties have been recorded and compromise that is arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

Looking to the nature of the offences registered in the FIR and the terms of the compromise deed, I think, parties should be allowed to compound/compromise the offences in order that they live in peace and harmony.

In that view of the matter, FIR No.206 dated 24.10.2011 registered under Sections 323, 324, 341 and 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Section 326 of 'IPC' was added lateron) at Police Station Sadar, Jagraon, District Ludhiana Rural is quashed by way of compounding/compromise along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom.

In view of the compromise dated 23.02.2017 (Annexure P-2), the FIR in question stands quashed. The petitioner-Harjit @ Harjeet Singh in CRM-M-8706-2017 is ordered to be released from jail.
