Petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 81 dated 22.02.2017, under Sections 323, 406, 498-A, 506 IPC, registered at Sector-31-Faridabad, District Faridabad.

It is submitted that during the pendency of this petition, the matter has been amicably resolved between the parties. The petitioner and respondent no.2 have decided to part ways. Petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 has been filed. Their statements at first motion, it is submitted have been recorded.

Learned counsel for the respondent no.2-complainant affirms and verifies the factual position as above and submits that his client has no objection, if this petition be allowed subject to strict adherence to the terms and conditions of the settlement by the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the State, verifies that the petitioner has joined investigation pursuant to interim order passed by this Court.

There are no allegations on behalf of the State that the petitioner is likely to abscond, if released on bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances noted above, especially keeping in view the settlement between the parties, but without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, it is considered just and expedient to allow this petition. Consequently, order dated 15.03.2017, is made absolute.

Liberty is afforded to respondent no.2 to move an appropriate application in this matter in case the terms and conditions of the settlement between the parties are not adhered to by the petitioner.
