Mr. Sushil K. Sharma, Advocate, has put in appearance on behalf of respondent No. 2. He states that a compromise has been entered into between the parties.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Bahadur Singh, informs the Court that the petitioner has joined investigation. He contends that on the basis of the statement of the petitioner, it has come to light that the weapon of offence has been destroyed by the petitioner and, therefore, Section 201 IPC has also been added. He, however, states that he is no more required for further investigation.

In view of the above, the present petition is allowed. The order

dated 17.03.2017 passed by this Court is made absolute. This shall, however, be subject to the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) (i) to (iv) Cr.P.C.
