LISA GILL, J.

This order shall dispose of two petitions i.e. Criminal Revision (F) No. 53 of 2014 and Criminal Misc. M- No. 29141 of 2015.

Mr. Rakesh Rao, petitioner in both the cases is present in person. Photocopies of his Pan Card as well as the driving licence produced in Court are taken on record subject to just exceptions.

The petitioner submits that the matter between the parties has been amicably resolved before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of the

Hon'ble Supreme Court. A photocopy of the settlement/agreement dated 22.07.2016 is produced in Court, which is taken on record subject to just exceptions. The parties have decided to part ways.

It is submitted that the complaint dated 21.08.2012 filed by the respondent-wife under Section 12 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 has been withdrawn. In view of the above said settlement proceedings, order passed under Section 125 Cr.P.C. also does not survive. Therefore, it is submitted that the present petitions have been rendered infructuous.

Learned counsel for the respondent affirms and verifies the aforementioned position.

In the facts and circumstances as above, both the petitions are disposed of accordingly.
