Petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No.22 dated 13.02.2017, under Section 406, 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station City Gurdaspur, District Gurdaspur.

During the pendency of this petition, the matter has been amicably resolved between the parties. The petitioner and respondent no.2 have decided to part ways. A petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, it is informed has since been filed. Part of the settled amount has been received by respondent no.2.

A photocopy of the compromise dated 12.08.2017 furnished in Court today by learned counsel for respondent no.2 is taken on record subject to just exceptions.

Learned counsel for respondent no.2 submits that his client has no objection in case this petition is allowed subject to the petitioner

strictly adhering to the terms and conditions of the settlement.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Daleep Chand, verifies that the petitioner has joined investigation. It is further verified that the petitioner is not involved in any other criminal case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances as above, especially the settlement arrived at between the parties, but without commenting upon or expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this petition is allowed.

In the event of arrest of the petitioner, he be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting/investigating Officer. Petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Liberty is however afforded to respondent no.2 to move an appropriate application in this matter in case the terms and conditions of the settlement between the parties are not adhered to by the petitioner.
