For the reasons mentioned in the application the same is allowed and delay of 80 days in filing the revision petition stands condoned.

CRR 2386-2017(O&M)

Vide judgment of conviction dated 17.9.2015, passed by learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Dhuri, petitioner was convicted under Sections 279, 304-A and 427 IPC and sentenced as under:-

1	Shingara Singh	279 IPC	To undergo R.I. for six months
		304-A IPC	To undergo R.I. for one year and to pay fine of Rs.1000/-. In default thereof, he will further undergo R.I. For seven days.
		427 IPC	To undergo R.I. for six months

All the sentences were directed to run concurrently.

Appeal against the said judgment was dismissed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Sangrur vide judgment dated 18.1.2017.

On the last date of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner after arguing for sometime, had restricted the prayer to the quantum of sentence only.

Custody certificate dated 15.11.2017 filed in Court today and the same is taken on record. It shows that the petitioner has undergone the total sentence of 5 months and 10 days, including remissions of 20 days. In this case, one person lost his life.

Considering the fact that about more than 400 persons daily lose their lives in the motor vehicular accidents in India and it is continuous process, I do not find any ground to show any leniency in the sentence.

Resultantly, the present revision petition stands dismissed.

Petitioner be re-arrested to undergo the remaining part of sentence.
