By this common order, above 5 writ petitions shall be disposed of as the controversy involved in all these petitions is identical. However, facts are being extracted from CWP No.10021 of 2015.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Mr. Jagdish Chander, Assistant, Haryana Roadways, Sonapat submitted that pursuant to the order dated 21.4.2017, Mr. Jai Pal Rana, General Manager, Haryana Roadways is present. He has placed order dated 3.5.2017 by which order dated 21.7.2014 which is the subject matter of writ petition has been withdrawn while restoring the order dated 21.7.2014. Despite dropping of COCP No.696 of 2014 at the behest of General Manager, Haryana Roadways, Sonapat, the present General Manager has proceeded to pass adverse order (contrary decision). Therefore, Mr. Jai Pal Rana, General

Manager, Haryana Roadways is liable to pay cost of ₹ 5,000/- to each of the petitioner and the same shall be paid from his own pocket within a period of three months from today. The consequential benefits which are yet to be released to the petitioner, the same shall be considered and disbursed in accordance with law within a period of three months from today.

Petitions stand disposed of.
