The petitioner has preferred the instant writ petition seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the impugned order dated 08.01.2016, by which, he has been directed to deposit a sum of Rs.7,50,822/-.

The petitioner herein joined services of the respondents- Corporation on 14.08.2014 and at the time of joining submitted two sureties, as required. During the course of employment, the petitioner was selected in the Engineers Services Examination conducted by the UPSC and in order to join the said services, the petitioner submitted his resignation as

on 06.04.2015. However, instead of relieving him from services, he was asked to deposit a sum of Rs.7,50,822/-. Aggrieved, the instant writ petition has been filed.

During the course of proceedings, an additional affidavit dated 02.03.2017 has been filed, wherein, as per para 7, it is mentioned that a consolidated No Dues Certificate has been issued by the respondents-Corporation, vide office order No.19 dated 02.03.2017, wherein, it is mentioned that nothing is due against the petitioner. While further submitting that the resignation of the petitioners stands absolute with no claim of the respondents-Corporation pending against him and no disciplinary proceedings are pending against the petitioner. The certificate is appended as Annexure R-3 with the additional affidavit.

In view of the fact that resignation of the petitioner has been accepted and a No Due Certificate has been issued, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the instant writ petition and seeks permission to withdraw the same.

In view of the above, the instant writ petition stands dismissed as withdrawn.
