

By this petition the petitioner had claimed that though he had retired on 30.11.2014 his retiral dues were unjustified delayed. Short affidavit has been filed whereby it has been mentioned that payments have been released. Counsel for the petitioner points out that even as per stand of respondents the leave encashment was paid after 11 months and the arrears of pension alongwith commutation were paid after 16 months. He therefore claims that some compensation should be awarded to the petitioner who retired as Class-IV employee for this delay. Counsel for the respondent is not in a position to deny this fact that there was unjustified delay in the payment of the retiral dues.

In my opinion, interest of justice would be met if the petitioner is awarded costs of Rs.20,000/- . In case costs are not paid within a period of 03 months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order failing which the petitioner would be entitled to claim interest @ 8 % per annum on the amount/s from the date/s it fell due.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending Civil Misc. Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
