The petitioner has come up in revision against the order dated 12.12.2016 (Annexure P-2), whereby, the petition filed under Section 125 Cr.P.C. by the petitioner has been dismissed.

During the pendency of revision, parties have entered into the compromise on 21.04.2017 which has been placed on record with the assistance of Ms.Rahis Pahwa. In terms of the compromise, the parties have agreed to abide by all the conditions of the compromise and they have decided to file a petition under Section 13B of HMA for divorce by mutual consent on 08.05.2017 at Gurgaon. It has been further agreed between the parties that petitioner has undertaken to transfer the shop situated at Model Town Market Hissar in favour of respondent and respondent/husband has also undertaken to give a sum of Rs.5,00,000/- as bank draft to the petitioner before the Civil Court at the time of second/final motion statement. The respondent/husband has undertaken to give the entire ornaments lying in the Locker No.288, Maharashtra Bank, Palam Vihar, Gurgaon to which the petitioner/wife had agreed. For that purpose both the parties would operate/open this locker in the last week of May, 2017 in the presence of some third person agreeable to both the parties. The third person so appointed shall prepare the total list of the articles and papers, if any, found in the locker and the inventory list shall be signed by both the parties and the person so appointed at the time of opening of the locker. The articles so given to the petitioner would be subject to the condition that she would suffer second motion statement. In case any document belonging to the second parties is found to be there, it shall be

handed over to the second party amicably without any objection on the parties of the petitioner/wife.

In view of the above, report of the Mediator of this case who was appointed as third person vide order 24.04.2017 passed by this Court has been received. According to the order 24.04.2017, both the parties had to operate the locker in her presence at Bank of Maharashtra, Sector 23, Gurgram. According to this report, locker was operated by both the parties in her presence on 29.05.2017. The detailed report in this regard has been placed on record.

In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of in view of the compromise arrived between the parties on 21.04.2015 and report of the Mediator dated 02.06.2017.
