The petitioner, who is wife of convict-Ravi Kumar has filed the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of direction to the Jail Superintendent, Hisar, for extending his parole for four weeks.

According to the petitioner, her husband Ravi Kumar was granted parole from 11.09.2017 uptill 24.10.2017. On 18.10.2017, he met with an accident, which resulting his legs getting fractured for which he was admitted in Civil Hospital, Fatehabad from where he was referred to a higher centre and admitted in Abrol Hospital, Fatehabad where he is recuperating since 18.10.2017. The attending doctor has opined that the petitioner's husband is in critical condition and only after a long time, he would be able to resume day to day life. As the parole already granted to the petitioner's husband is expiring today, the same may be extended.

Learned counsel for the parties have been heard and the writ petition and appending documents perused. From the documents annexed with the petition, it is not made out that the petitioner's husband is admitted in any hospital. In the certificate annexed P-1, issued by Dr. Rajesh Abrol, it has only been indicated that the petitioner's husband is getting treatment for the fracture which he had suffered. Getting treatment does not mean that the petitioner's husband is lying admitted in any hospital and such a treatment can be obtained by him even by visiting the doctor.

In view of the same, no case is made out for extending the parole already granted to the petitioner's husband uptill today. However, in order to enable the petitioner's husband to surrender, but as the parole already granted to him is expiring today, it would be in the fitness of things to extend the parole for one week.

Resultantly, the petition is disposed of by extending the parole already granted to the petitioner's husband for a week starting from today. He shall now surrender before the jail authorities on 31.10.2017.
