This petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India read with Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of direction to the respondents for granting emergency parole to the petitioner for a period of 2 weeks.

In pursuance of order dated 22.03.2017, passed by this Court, the matter was inquired into and the learned State counsel, on instructions, states that the facts that the sister of the petitioner died on 17.03.2017 and that her bhog ceremony is slated for 26.03.2017, have been found to be correct.

The petitioner was on bail during trial and did not misuse the

concession of bail. He has completed approximately 4 years out of substantive sentence of 5 years. There is a panchayatnama (Annexure P-2) given by the Gram Panchayat, Mehal Kalan that there is no apprehension of breach of peace in the village in case the petitioner is allowed parole to attend the bhog ceremony of his sister.

Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on parole for a period of two weeks from the date of his release, as per the Rules, on furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, concerned.

The petitioner shall surrender before the jail authorities after expiry of two weeks, on the date and time to be indicated by the releasing authority at the time of his release.
